This year we saw another successful Easter race day. We raised \$1964.00 from this event and it was a fun day for all who attended. What we learned from the event this year was the need to improve our raffles for the day. Taking this on board, we hope to improve next years Easter Races to be even more successful.

During the October long weekend we had a karaoke night. As our second event for the long weekend it wasn't near as successful as our arts festival last year, although we did at one time have over 40 people at this years event. We raised \$195.15 from the night's raffle.

The money being raised by the Progress Association events has for some years been going towards the refurbishment of the hall and the installation of toilets and new kitchen for the opportunity to better utilise the hall for functions.

This year we engaged Rob Locke to provide architectural drawings to be submitted to council in 2019. Once council approval had been received, we will put this work out to tender. We will also begin the process of finding additional funding to finance this project.

As part of our ability to apply for funding we were required to update our constitution. A draft has been written and will be presented at the Annual General Meeting **Sunday, December 30, 2018**.
